- 1. A very uncertain time militarily.
- 2. The "Southern" sixth form is depleted in numbers and tuition and studies are "jagged" due to school changes
- 3. In a community hall in the centre of Brockenhurst a kind of Home Guard organisation is being structured.
- 4. Several sixth formers volunteer to join this ragged band of warriors.
- 5. They are shown how to put bullets into a gun and how to hold the gun.
- 6. Some nights a lorry would take them into the Forest and they would stand under tree clumps with the wind moaning through the branches above and watch for parachutists.
- 7. A rustling bush or a horse stamping its hoof nearby and the gun was clutched more tightly.
- 8. But there was a touch of adventure about it.
- 9. Until.....
- 10. These brave "soldiers" were summoned to the Headmaster's study (Mr G B H Jones MC MA (note the Military Cross)..
- 11. "What do you boys think you are doing? Who gave you permission? What do you think your parents would say? I tell you, there is nothing glamorous about war".
- 12. And so it proved to be as the next 5 years unfolded.
